## **MUSEUMS & ART**

## **OUTDOOR SPACES**

Our award-winning outdoor spaces include the RiverWalk, Joe Louis Greenway, the Lake St. Clair Metropark beach, and the gorgeous and expansive Belle Isle, to name a few.
